NARRATIVE

New York State Agriculture and Markets Law (NYS AML) Article 25-AA provides for a locally-initiated mechanism for the protection and enhancement of New York State's agricultural land as a viable segment of its local and state economies and as an economic and environmental resource of major importance. The Agricultural Districts Program is articulated by this law wherein viable agricultural land may be included within a certified Agricultural District affording certain benefits and protections in order to perpetuate farming.

NYS AML Section 303-b allows County legislative bodies the opportunity to designate an annual thirty-day period within which a land owner may request the inclusion of land, which is predominantly viable agricultural land, within an existing certified Agricultural District. The County designated the month of March as the annual thirty-day period for 2017.

The Suffolk County Agricutural and Farmland Protection Board reviewed 10 applications totaling 13 parcels of land for possible inclusion within certified Agricultural Districts at their April 27, 2017 meeting. The parcels are located within the towns of Brookhaven, East Hampton, Riverhead, Southampton, Southold, and the Village of Islandia, in the Town of Islip. The Board recommended 13 out of 13 parcels (94.2 acres) of land to be included within a certified Agricultural District. They were determined by the Board to be viable agricultural lands that would serve the public interest by assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry within the districts. Please note that all actions on properties included in an Agricultural District continue to be subject to local zoning and subdivision regulations and that this designation does not preclude adherance to such local regulations.

The Suffolk County Agricutural and Farmland Protection Board is in the process of presenting its recommendations by Introductory Resolution to the Suffolk County Legislature for possible inclusion into existing certified Agricultural Districts. Once the recommendations are approved by the Suffolk County Legislature, they are sent to the Commissioner of NYS Department of Agriculture & Markets, who has 30 days after receipt of the County resolution, to certify those parcels of land recommended by the County for inclusion into a certified Agricultural District. The Commissioner certifies whether the inclusion of predominately viable agricultural land, as proposed, is feasible and shall serve the public interest in assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry within these district(s).

WHEREAS, Local Law No. 31-2014, a Charter Law Amending the ½% Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program (DWPP) for Enhanced Water Quality Protection, Wastewater Infrastructure and General Fund Property Tax Relief for Suffolk County, created the 2014 Enhanced Suffolk County Water Quality Protection Program, codified in Suffolk County Charter Article XIIA; and

WHEREAS, in November of 2014, two-thirds of Suffolk County voters approved Proposition No. 5-2014, enacting the provisions of Resolution No. 579-2014. Local Law No. 31-2014, "A Charter Law Amending the ½% Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program (DWPP) for Enhanced Water Quality Protection, Wastewater Infrastructure and General Property Fund Tax Relief for Suffolk County." This Proposition recognized the essential nature of the Drinking Water Protection Program to the well-being of the County's drinking water supply and required \$29.4 million in serial bonds be issued through the Capital Program for water quality protection program projects; and

WHEREAS, THE 2016 Adopted Capital Budget contains three water quality protection 2014 Referendum capital projects totaling \$29.4 million; CP 8732 for land purchases (\$20.0 million), CP 8733 for water quality projects (\$4.7 million), CP 8734 for sewer improvement projects (\$4.7 million); and

WHEREAS, this capital project provides \$20 million in serial bond funding for the acquisition by the County, by fee, lease or easement, of interests in land associated with the Suffolk County Drinking Water Protection Program; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 915-2008 and Resolution No. 466-2016, authorized planning/appraisal steps for the acquisition of said property; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Brookhaven ("Town") has approved Resolution No. 2017-0056 on January 10, 2017 authorizing the acquisition of the subject property in partnership with the County of Suffolk; and

WHEREAS, the Environmental Trust Review Board has reviewed the appraisals and the report of the Internal Appraisal Review Board and has approved the purchase price and authorized the Director of Real Estate and/or his designee to negotiate the acquisition; and

WHEREAS, based upon the Environmental Trust Review Board approved value, an offer to acquire the subject property was made to and accepted by the owner of said property; and

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
