Suffolk County Wetland Restoration – Gardiner Park East & West Part 3 EAF - Reasons Supporting SEQRA Negative Declaration:

The Proposed Action involves marsh restoration of approximately 69+/- acres Suffolk County marsh (located on the south side of Montauk Highway, ±570' east of Oakneck Lane, West Bay Shore) using an integrated marsh management technique, which was evaluated as part of Suffolk County's Vector Control and Wetlands Management Long-Term Plan Generic Environmental Impact Statement and State Environmental Quality Review Act Findings Statement (adopted March 22, 2007). Based on the Part 2 EAF, two categories were identified as having potential moderate to large impacts due to the existing site conditions and details of the proposed wetland restoration activities:

Question 1.a (The proposed action may involve construction on land where depth to water table is less than 3 feet): The nature of the Proposed Action involves wetland restoration activities within the tidal marsh areas. Depth to groundwater is less than three feet in the area; however the project is designed to restore tidal flow, enhance tidal exchange with the marsh surface, improve conditions for proper marsh accretion and restoration of marsh vegetation. Restoration of healthy marsh will help buffer flood and storm surge of the adjacent residential area, thereby reducing threats to on-site wastewater systems during flood events. The project will reduce runoff and nitrogen loading to the bay, groundwater, and aquifers during storm and flood events by preventing the continued dieback of vegetation and allowing natural vegetation to return to the pannes.

Question 3.c (The proposed action may involve dredging more than 100 cubic yards of material from a wetland or water body). The Proposed Action is designed to have a positive effect on existent marshes. The Proposed Action is expected to improve the current degraded grid ditching features of the marshes by strategically filling them with local material and coir logs. Implementation includes excavations to restore and naturalize tidal channels (i.e., meandering runnels cut to slope) to improve tidal exchange in the marsh interior. The Proposed Action will include the creation of micropools connected to tidal channels by shallow connector runnels in order to enhance natural conditions by allowing biological flow between the bay and the marsh to control marsh mosquito species. Overall, implementation of the Proposed Action would have long-term moderate to major beneficial impacts to wetlands. During the construction period, there would be some unavoidable but temporary and minor adverse impacts resulting from the implementation of the Proposed Action relating to the movement and placement of sediment to reorient the tidal channels and create micropools. The movement of sediment is anticipated to result in some short-term turbidity. However, this increase in turbidity would be temporary and localized to the specific work area and would be contained to the extent possible using coir logs and sediment barriers as shown on the Conceptual Plan Details. The restoration will progress from the inside of the marsh toward the shoreline, thus allowing for settlement of restored tidal channels before they are fully connected with the tidal cycle. All storage and staging of equipment will occur in the identified upland area, which will be protected by silt fencing.

Restoration activities would be relatively short-term (approximately six weeks) and work within wetlands would only occur between Oct. 1st - March 31st.

The following measures will help ensure disturbance to healthy marsh is minimized:

- Low impact (<2.0 psi) equipment designed to limit disturbance to marsh habitat will be utilized.
- To the greatest extent practical, construction vehicles and crews will avoid traversing the same path to reduce the compaction of the marsh to prevent total loss of vegetation within the "path" and instead, multiple routes for both equipment and personnel would be utilized.
- No work will occur after "wet" periods.
- To the maximum extent possible, micropools will be located within existing pannes of unvegetated areas (or degraded habitat) and invasive Phragmites australis wherever possible in order to limit disturbance to desirable marsh vegetation.



- Proposed projects that would exceed a numeric threshold contained in a question should result in the reviewing agency checking the box "Moderate to large impact may occur."
- The reviewer is not expected to be an expert in environmental analysis.
- If you are not sure or undecided about the size of an impact, it may help to review the sub-questions for the general question and consult the workbook.
- When answering a question consider all components of the proposed activity, that is, the "whole action".
- Consider the possibility for long-term and cumulative impacts as well as direct impacts.
- Answer the question in a reasonable manner considering the scale and context of the project.

Suffolk County Wetland Restoration – Smith Point North Part 3 EAF - Reasons Supporting SEQRA Negative Declaration:

The Proposed Action involves marsh restoration at the 80+/- Suffolk County owned park in Shirley through an integrated marsh management technique, which was evaluated as part of Suffolk County's Vector Control and Wetlands Management Long-Term Plan Generic Environmental Impact Statement and State Environmental Quality Review Act Findings Statement (adopted March 22, 2007). Based on the Part 2 EAF, two categories were identified as having potential moderate to large impacts due to the existing site conditions and details of the proposed wetland restoration activities:

Question 1.a (The proposed action may involve construction on land where depth to water table is less than 3 feet): The nature of the Proposed Action involves wetland restoration activities within the tidal marsh areas. Depth to groundwater is less than three feet in the area; however the project is designed to restore tidal flow, enhance tidal exchange with the marsh surface, improve conditions for proper marsh accretion and restoration of marsh vegetation. Restoration of healthy marsh will help buffer flood and storm surge of the adjacent residential area, thereby reducing threats to on-site wastewater systems during flood events. The project will reduce runoff and nitrogen loading to the bay, groundwater, and aquifers during storm and flood events by preventing the continued dieback of vegetation and allowing natural vegetation to return to the pannes.

Question 3.c (The proposed action may involve dredging more than 100 cubic yards of material from a wetland or water body). The Proposed Action is designed to have a positive effect on existent marshes. The Proposed Action is expected to improve the current degraded grid ditching features of the marshes by strategically filling them with local material and coir logs. Implementation includes excavations to restore and naturalize tidal channels (i.e., meandering runnels cut to slope) to improve tidal exchange in the marsh interior. The Proposed Action will include the creation of micropools connected to tidal channels by shallow connector runnels in order to enhance natural conditions by allowing biological flow between the bay and the marsh to control marsh mosquito species. Overall, implementation of the Proposed Action would have long-term moderate to major beneficial impacts to wetlands. During the construction period, there would be some unavoidable but temporary and minor adverse impacts resulting from the implementation of the Proposed Action relating to the movement and placement of sediment to reorient the tidal channels and create micropools. The movement of sediment is anticipated to result in some short-term turbidity. However, this increase in turbidity would be temporary and localized to the specific work area and would be contained to the extent possible using coir logs and sediment barriers as shown on the Conceptual Plan Details. The restoration will progress from the inside of the marsh toward the shoreline, thus allowing for settlement of restored tidal channels before they are fully connected with the tidal cycle. All storage and staging of equipment will occur in the identified upland area, which will be protected by silt fencing.

Restoration activities would be relatively short-term (approximately six weeks) and work within wetlands would only occur between Oct. 1st - March 31st.

The following measures will help ensure disturbance to healthy marsh is minimized:

- Low impact (<2.0 psi) equipment designed to limit disturbance to marsh habitat will be utilized.
- To the greatest extent practical, construction vehicles and crews will avoid traversing the same path to reduce the compaction of the marsh to prevent total loss of vegetation within the "path" and instead, multiple routes for both equipment and personnel would be utilized.
- No work will occur after "wet" periods.
- To the maximum extent possible, micropools will be located within existing pannes of unvegetated areas (or degraded habitat) and invasive Phragmites australis wherever possible in order to limit disturbance to desirable marsh vegetation.



Suffolk County Wetland Restoration – Timber Point Part 3 EAF - Reasons Supporting SEQRA Negative Declaration:

The Proposed Action involves marsh restoration of approximately 30+/- acres of New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) marsh system (located southeast corner of River Road and Great River Road in Great River) using an integrated marsh management technique, which was evaluated as part of Suffolk County's Vector Control and Wetlands Management Long-Term Plan Generic Environmental Impact Statement and State Environmental Quality Review Act Findings Statement (adopted March 22, 2007). Based on the Part 2 EAF, two categories were identified as having potential moderate to large impacts due to the existing site conditions and details of the proposed wetland restoration activities:

Question 1.a (The proposed action may involve construction on land where depth to water table is less than 3 feet): The nature of the Proposed Action involves wetland restoration activities within the tidal marsh areas. Depth to groundwater is less than three feet in the area; however the project is designed to restore tidal flow, enhance tidal exchange with the marsh surface, improve conditions for proper marsh accretion and restoration of marsh vegetation. Restoration of healthy marsh will help buffer flood and storm surge of the adjacent residential area, thereby reducing threats to on-site wastewater systems during flood events. The project will reduce runoff and nitrogen loading to the bay, groundwater, and aquifers during storm and flood events by preventing the continued dieback of vegetation and allowing natural vegetation to return to the pannes.

Question 3.c (The proposed action may involve dredging more than 100 cubic yards of material from a wetland or water body). The Proposed Action is designed to have a positive effect on existent marshes. The Proposed Action is expected to improve the current degraded grid ditching features of the marshes by strategically filling them with local material and coir logs. Implementation includes excavations to restore and naturalize tidal channels (i.e., meandering runnels cut to slope) to improve tidal exchange in the marsh interior. The Proposed Action will include the creation of micropools connected to tidal channels by shallow connector runnels in order to enhance natural conditions by allowing biological flow between the bay and the marsh to control marsh mosquito species. Overall, implementation of the Proposed Action would have long-term moderate to major beneficial impacts to wetlands. During the construction period, there would be some unavoidable but temporary and minor adverse impacts resulting from the implementation of the Proposed Action relating to the movement and placement of sediment to reorient the tidal channels and create micropools. The movement of sediment is anticipated to result in some short-term turbidity. However, this increase in turbidity would be temporary and localized to the specific work area and would be contained to the extent possible using coir logs and sediment barriers as shown on the Conceptual Plan Details. The restoration will progress from the inside of the marsh toward the shoreline, thus allowing for settlement of restored tidal channels before they are fully connected with the tidal cycle. All storage and staging of equipment will occur in the identified upland area, which will be protected by silt fencing.

Restoration activities would be relatively short-term (approximately six weeks) and work within wetlands would only occur between Oct. 1st - March 31st.

The following measures will help ensure disturbance to healthy marsh is minimized:

- Low impact (<2.0 psi) equipment designed to limit disturbance to marsh habitat will be utilized.
- To the greatest extent practical, construction vehicles and crews will avoid traversing the same path to reduce the compaction of the marsh to prevent total loss of vegetation within the "path" and instead, multiple routes for both equipment and personnel would be utilized.
- No work will occur after "wet" periods.
- To the maximum extent possible, micropools will be located within existing pannes of unvegetated areas (or degraded habitat) and invasive Phragmites australis wherever possible in order to limit disturbance to desirable marsh vegetation.



Suffolk County Wetland Restoration –West Sayville Part 3 EAF - Reasons Supporting SEQRA Negative Declaration:

The Proposed Action involves marsh restoration of approximately 73+/- acres Suffolk County marsh system (located approximately 1,800 LF south of the intersection of Montauk Highway and Rollstone Ave. in West Sayville) using an integrated marsh management technique, which was evaluated as part of Suffolk County's Vector Control and Wetlands Management Long-Term Plan Generic Environmental Impact Statement and State Environmental Quality Review Act Findings Statement (adopted March 22, 2007). Based on the Part 2 EAF, two categories were identified as having potential moderate to large impacts due to the existing site conditions and details of the proposed wetland restoration activities:

Question 1.a (The proposed action may involve construction on land where depth to water table is less than 3 feet): The nature of the Proposed Action involves wetland restoration activities within the tidal marsh areas. Depth to groundwater is less than three feet in the area; however the project is designed to restore tidal flow, enhance tidal exchange with the marsh surface, improve conditions for proper marsh accretion and restoration of marsh vegetation. Restoration of healthy marsh will help buffer flood and storm surge of the adjacent residential area, thereby reducing threats to on-site wastewater systems during flood events. The project will reduce runoff and nitrogen loading to the bay, groundwater, and aquifers during storm and flood events by preventing the continued dieback of vegetation and allowing natural vegetation to return to the pannes.

Question 3.c (The proposed action may involve dredging more than 100 cubic yards of material from a wetland or water body). The Proposed Action is designed to have a positive effect on existent marshes. The Proposed Action is expected to improve the current degraded grid ditching features of the marshes by strategically filling them with local material and coir logs. Implementation includes excavations to restore and naturalize tidal channels (i.e., meandering runnels cut to slope) to improve tidal exchange in the marsh interior. The Proposed Action will include the creation of micropools connected to tidal channels by shallow connector runnels in order to enhance natural conditions by allowing biological flow between the bay and the marsh to control marsh mosquito species. Overall, implementation of the Proposed Action would have long-term moderate to major beneficial impacts to wetlands. During the construction period, there would be some unavoidable but temporary and minor adverse impacts resulting from the implementation of the Proposed Action relating to the movement and placement of sediment to reorient the tidal channels and create micropools. The movement of sediment is anticipated to result in some short-term turbidity. However, this increase in turbidity would be temporary and localized to the specific work area and would be contained to the extent possible using coir logs and sediment barriers as shown on the Conceptual Plan Details. The restoration will progress from the inside of the marsh toward the shoreline, thus allowing for settlement of restored tidal channels before they are fully connected with the tidal cycle. All storage and staging of equipment will occur in the identified upland area, which will be protected by silt fencing.

Restoration activities would be relatively short-term (approximately six weeks) and work within wetlands would only occur between Oct. 1st - March 31st.

The following measures will help ensure disturbance to healthy marsh is minimized:

- Low impact (<2.0 psi) equipment designed to limit disturbance to marsh habitat will be utilized.
- To the greatest extent practical, construction vehicles and crews will avoid traversing the same path to reduce the compaction of the marsh to prevent total loss of vegetation within the "path" and instead, multiple routes for both equipment and personnel would be utilized.
- No work will occur after "wet" periods.
- To the maximum extent possible, micropools will be located within existing pannes of unvegetated areas (or degraded habitat) and invasive Phragmites australis wherever possible in order to limit disturbance to desirable marsh vegetation.

Brief Description of Proposed Action (include purpose or need/attach relevant design reports, plans, etc.): Improvements to CR-1 (County Line Road) is a road rehabilitation and resurfacing project with limits from Merrick Road (Route 27A) to Matthew Drive to the north. The total length of the project is approximately 7,875 LF. There are two intersections along the route, County Road 12 (Oak Street) and NYS Route 27 (Sunrise Highway) where no work will be performed. The project is being designed under NYSDOT construction specifications.

The work consists of the replacement of existing drainage catch basins, new sidewalks, curbs and driveway restorations, limited full depth pavement restoration and a final asphalt overlay. All work is limited to be within the public Right of Way.

There are two storm water outfalls connected to the existing drainage system, however there will not be any modifications to the outfalls.

During the construction phase traffic safety and sediment control features will be implimented. NYSDOT Work Zone Traffic Control (WZTC) details will be implimented to protect the traveling public and maintain the safety of the construction workers. Additionally, errosion and sediment control measures will be implimented duringconstruction; silt fencing, Straw bales, inly protection bags are specified in the design to protect the existing drainage system / discharge points from construction generated sediments.

The proposed construction will remove some existing trees; these will be replaced with appropriate streetscape trees. There are not any storm resilency features in the proposed design, as this is a rehabilitation and resurfacing project. Complete Streets design was considered, All sidewalk and curbramps will comply with latest ADA regulations.






