WHEREAS, the enhancement process is proposed to utilize either peracetic acid, hydrogen peroxide or ozone; and

WHEREAS, the existing UV building has sufficient room for the system enhancement work and all of the enhancement work will take place within the existing building; and

WHEREAS, while the current system currently is efficient and meets regulations, the proposed UV enhancement work will increase long term system efficiency and provide the level of disinfection required in the years to come; now, therefore, be it
